RS 17 §170. Immunization of persons entering schools, kindergartens, colleges, proprietary or vocational schools, and day care centers for the first time; immunization of persons entering sixth grade; electronic transmission of immunization compliance reports

A.(1)(a) Each person entering any school within the state for the first time, including elementary and secondary schools, kindergartens, colleges, universities, proprietary schools, vocational schools, and licensed day care centers, at the time of registration or entry shall present satisfactory evidence of immunity to or immunization against vaccine-preventable diseases according to a schedule approved by the office of public health, Louisiana Department of Health, or shall present evidence of an immunization program in progress.

(b) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year and thereafter, each person entering the sixth grade in any school within the state shall present satisfactory evidence of immunity to or immunization against vaccine-preventable diseases according to a schedule approved by the office of public health, Louisiana Department of Health, or shall present evidence of an immunization program in progress.

(2) The schedule shall include but not be limited to measles, mumps, rubella, diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, poliomyelitis, meningococcal disease, and hemophilus influenzae Type B invasive infections.

(3) The schedule may provide specific requirements based on age, grade in school, or type of school. At its own discretion and with the approval of the office of public health, an educational institution or licensed day care center may require immunizations or proof of immunity more extensive than required by the schedule approved by the office of public health.

B. A person transferring from another school system in or out of the state shall submit either a certificate of immunization or a letter from his personal physician or a public health clinic indicating immunizations against the diseases in the schedule approved by the office of public health in accordance with Subsection A of this Section having been performed, or a statement that such immunizations are in progress.

C. If booster immunizations for the diseases enumerated in the schedule approved by the office of public health are advised by that office, such booster immunizations shall be administered before the person enters a school system within the state.

D.(1) Chief administrators of all elementary and secondary schools, kindergartens, colleges, universities, proprietary schools, vocational schools, and licensed day care centers whether public or private within this state shall:

(a) Be responsible for checking students' records to see that the provisions of this Section are enforced.

(b) Electronically transmit immunization compliance reports to the Louisiana Department of Health, office of public health, when the public or private school operates an existing student-specific electronic data system.

(2) The provisions of this Section which relate to the electronic transmission of data shall be implemented according to rules and regulations promulgated by the Louisiana Department of Health in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

E. No person seeking to enter any school or facility enumerated in Subsection A of this Section shall be required to comply with the provisions of this Section if the student or his parent or guardian submits either a written statement from a physician stating that the procedure is contraindicated for medical reasons, or a written dissent from the student or his parent or guardian is presented.

F. In the event of an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease at the location of an educational institution or facility enumerated in Subsection A of this Section, the administrators of that institution or facility are empowered, upon the recommendation of the office of public health, to exclude from attendance unimmunized students and clients until the appropriate disease incubation period has expired or the unimmunized person presents evidence of immunization.

§170.4. Immunizations of certain persons against meningococcal disease; exceptions

A.(1)(a) Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, a student shall provide satisfactory evidence of current immunization against meningococcal disease in accordance with a directive provided by the state Department of Education and the Louisiana Department of Health that shall be based on the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a condition of entry into the sixth grade and as a condition of entry into the eleventh grade at any city, parish, or other local public school or nonpublic school.

(b) Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, a student who is eleven years old and is entering a grade other than the sixth grade and a student who is sixteen years old and is entering a grade other than the eleventh grade shall provide satisfactory evidence of current immunization against meningococcal disease in accordance with a directive provided by the state Department of Education and the Louisiana Department of Health that shall be based on the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention as a condition of entry into such grade at any city, parish, or other local public school or nonpublic school.

(c) Except as provided in Subsection B of this Section, each student who is eleven years old and each student who is sixteen years old and is participating in an approved home study program pursuant to R.S. 17:236.1 shall provide satisfactory evidence of current immunization against meningococcal disease in accordance with a directive provided by the state Department of Education and the Louisiana Department of Health that shall be based on the recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education as provided by rule adopted by the board in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

(2) The chief administrator of any city, parish, or other local public school or nonpublic school that educates students who are subject to the requirements of this Section shall be responsible for checking students' records to ensure that the provisions of this Section are enforced.

B. The provisions of Subsection A of this Section shall not apply to the following persons:

(1) Any person whose parent, tutor, or legal guardian signs a waiver stating that the person shall not be immunized against meningococcal disease for religious or other personal reasons.

(2) Any person whose parent, tutor, or legal guardian has submitted a written statement from a physician stating that the immunization is contraindicated for medical reasons.

(3) Any person who is unable to comply with the provisions of Subsection A of this Section due to a shortage in the supply of available vaccinations against meningococcal disease.

C.(1) The provisions of this Section shall be implemented according to rules and regulations promulgated by the secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health, which shall include an implementation schedule based on ensuring sufficient availability of the required vaccine.

(2) The secretary of the Louisiana Department of Health shall provide such rules, including the implementation schedule, to the state Department of Education. The state Department of Education shall notify each city, parish, and other local school board, the governing authority of each nonpublic school system or school in the case of a school not a part of a school system, and the parent or legal guardian of any student participating in an approved home study program as specified in Subparagraph (A)(1)(c) of this Section of the requirements of this Section and the rules and schedule for their implementation as provided by this Section.

D. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to require any city, parish, or other local public school board, any nonpublic school system or nonpublic school, the state Department of Education, or the Louisiana Department of Health to provide or pay for immunizations against meningococcal disease.

E. Any written communication issued to students pursuant to this Section shall include notice that the student's parent, tutor, or legal guardian may be exempt from compliance with this Section under the conditions set forth in Subsection B of this Section.

On May 4, 2022 Ponchatoula High School posted a letter from LDH on their facebook page. The letter referenced the statute for the immunization requirement for meningitis but they omitted the section in the statute that specifically requires them to inform parents of the option to submit an exemption: "<u>Any written</u> communication issued to students pursuant to this Section shall include notice that the student's parent, tutor, or legal guardian may be exempt from compliance with this Section under the conditions set forth in <u>Subsection B of this Section</u>."

The school posted the letter and a parent commented saying there are exemptions. They then deleted her comment and turned off commenting for the public.

This letter is to inform you of this school year **2016-2017** compliance levels. Your Daycare has successfully met the compliance level required by Centers for Disease Control and Louisiana Office of Public Health. Students enrolled in your Daycare have meet immunization requirements established by the state school immunization law. Thank you for the great work done during this school year in assuring students' immunizations is up-to-date. This process is important to the health and well-being of all in our community. Your commitment to this process is greatly appreciated.

The Immunization Program continues to identify a number of students enrolled in school without proof of a valid immunization record. Non-compliance with the state school immunization law can pose a significant public health risk to your students, staff and the communities you serve. Accordingly, if a child is not in compliance with the immunization schedule, he or she should be excluded from school until an up-to-date shot record is provided. The State Immunization Law clearly states that students are required to present proof of immunization at the time of registration. Your assistance in enforcement of this law for the new school year is greatly appreciated.

As a reminder, Act 73 requires that all schools use LINKS (Louisiana Immunization Network for Kids Statewide) for reporting and filing immunization school compliance reports to the Louisiana Immunization Program. Please be reminded also, that the deadline for reporting compliance of all students enrolled in Kindergarten, and the sixth grade is **November 1, 2016**. The follow up, and submission of the final Immunization Report is due on **January 31, 2017**.

Enclosed is a LINKS Individual user agreement for any new school nurse or staff that will need a Links user name and password. The LINKS Individual User Removal form should be used for nurses no longer working for your school system. Please mail the forms back to my office. Please let me know if you need LINKS training or LINKS review, and I will be happy to schedule a class.

Please contact my office at 504-599-0127 if you have any questions. All rash illnesses associated with a fever such as chickenpox or measles must be reported to my office immediately. Thank you again for your assistance in seeing that the children of Louisiana are properly immunized.

Diocese of Baton Rouge Catholic Schools Diocesan, Parochial and Inter-Parochial Schools Vaccination Policy Updated February 14, 2022

As schools begin the registration process for the 2022-23 school year, questions have arisen regarding the possibility of a state-required COVID-19 vaccination for students. The current policy from the Administrative Manual (see below) for schools in our diocese indicates that schools may waive required immunizations that are required by the Louisiana State Department of Health.

Administrative Manual 4.10.4: Immunization

All students entering any school of the diocese shall present records attesting to their immunization in compliance with State health requirements at the time of registration. The school may waive a required immunization if a parent submits (a) a written statement from a physician attesting that the immunization is contraindicated for medical reasons or (b) a written statement refusing immunization for the student. Such statement shall be maintained in the student's cumulative folder.

In the event of an outbreak of a vaccine-preventable disease, a school may exclude any un-immunized student from attendance until the appropriate disease incubation period has expired or until the parent presents records attesting to immunization of the student.

Though schools currently may choose not to grant waivers for childhood immunizations, a new COVID-19 requirement may be especially problematic for parents. Therefore, the following policy is in effect for all diocesan, parochial and interparochial schools:

While we affirm the value of vaccination for COVID-19 and acknowledge and encourage all students to be vaccinated for the virus, no child will be refused admission to a Catholic school in the Diocese of Baton Rouge for the 2022-23 school year based on their vaccination status for the COVID-19 virus. All other childhood vaccine requirements that the school presently has in place will remain intact.

Catholic schools in the diocese have been especially successful in providing in-person learning the past two years during the pandemic, and much of that success is attributable to the partnership between schools and parents. Thank you for your commitment to the ministry of Catholic education!

Pre-Kindergarten

A child must be four years of age on or before September 30th of the incoming school year. Copies of the following documents are required with the application:

2. Certificate of Baptism (if applicable)

3. Immunization Record: Official State of Louisiana (or other) Universal Certificate of Immunization which includes the seal / stamp and is signed by the physician (A copy of My Chart records, etc. is not the immunization certificate). Immunizations Required:

Kindergarten

A child must be five years of age on or before September 30th of the incoming school year.

2. Certificate of Baptism (if applicable)

3. Immunization Record: Official State of Louisiana (or other) Universal Certificate of Immunization which includes the seal / stamp and is signed by the physician (A copy of My Chart records, etc. is not the immunization certificate). Immunizations Required:

3 doses of Hep B

*5 doses DTaP

**4 doses polio vaccine - last dose after 4 years of age

2 doses of MMR vaccine (measles, mumps & rubella) with last dose at or after 4 years of age

2 doses of Varicella vaccine or documented history of the disease

*Students that received their fourth dose of DTaP at age 4 or older do not need a 5th dose on record.

**Students that received their third dose of IPV at age 4 or older do not need a fourth dose on record.

5. Any educational / psychological evaluation administered to your child

6. \$275 Application Fee (Payment required while submitting the application.)

Grades 1-8

For First Grade, a child must be six years of age on or before September 30th of the incoming school year. Copies of the following documents are required with the application:

1. Official State Birth Certificate

2. Certificate of Baptism (if applicable)

3. Immunization Record: Official State of Louisiana (or other) Universal Certificate of Immunization which includes the seal / stamp and is signed by the physician (A copy of My Chart records, etc. is not the immunization certificate). Additional Immunization required:

1 dose of Meningococcal vaccine (MenACWY) at 6th grade entry

- 4. Student's Social Security Card (due after an offer of admissions)
- 5. Final report card from previous school
- 6. Most recent report card
- 7. Most recent standardized tests scores

8 Any educational / psychological evaluation administered to your child

9. \$275 Application Fee (Payment required while submitting the application.)

IMMUNIZATIONS / APPLIES FOR ALL GRADE LEVELS

A student's immunizations must be up to date according to state guidelines in order to be granted admissions. Those with *medical* exemptions will be considered on an individual basis. The record must be signed by a physician. All dates must be entered and it is the parent's responsibility to send updated records to the school as new immunizations are administered. Immunizations will need to be up to date by school entry in August 2022.

ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES

The following will be considered when reviewing applications for admission into Our Lady of Mercy Catholic School:

- Children who are Catholic and are currently registered parishioners at Our Lady of Mercy Church Parish
- Children who have siblings currently attending Our Lady of Mercy
- Children of alumni
- Out-of-Parish Catholic children
- Children of other faith traditions

In determining admission, the administration will review the academic, discipline and attendance records of students transferring from another school. *Please note that the Our Lady of Mercy School reserves the right to contact and obtain a recommendation from the child's previous school/center*. The administration must have a reasonable expectation of student success prior to an offer of admission. The pastor and school administration reserve the right to make final decisions on admissions.

Immunizations:

Under state law (Act 771) all students are required to have proof of immunization. A legible copy of current immunization status must be kept on file in the health office for all students enrolled. Parents of students who are lacking immunizations will be notified by the school nurse and advised of which immunizations are needed. For the child to remain in school, these records must be updated in a timely manner. If compliance is not forthcoming, the parent will be asked to keep the child at home until the immunization issue is resolved. Missing school days due to incomplete immunizations will be considered absences. Any parent experiencing a problem obtaining immunizations for the child can contact the school nurse.

Students who are enrolled BEFORE the 2020-21 school year: A required immunization may be waived by the school if a parent submits: a) a written statement from a physician attesting that the immunization is contraindicated for medical reasons; or b) a written statement refusing immunization for the student. Such statement shall be maintained in the student's cumulative folder. Documentation is required yearly.

My husband and I have religious and philosophical objections to vaccinations.

We had been accepted for a daycare spot at Rayner Learning Center

(http://www.bethshalomsynagogue.org/rayner-center) before I gave birth in August 2015. When I went to visit prior to him attending (November 2015), the center director told me that the only thing I still needed to submit was my son's vaccination records. I told her that we had decided to not vaccinate or to at least delay vaccines. She informed me that our child would not be able to attend their center until he was vaccinated because it is "against Jewish law to not vaccinate." I submitted our son's homeprophylaxis records (a homeopathic "alternative" to vaccination) but was informed the board of directors would not allow an unvaccinated child to attend the center.

We had to hire an in-home nanny to care for our child so I could return to work. We paid at least twice as much as attending daycare, in spite of the fact that we had a confirmed "spot" in daycare before our son's birth. The center didn't even refund our entire registration fee!

In July 2016, we tried to enroll our son at Southside Child Development Center

(http://www.southsidechild.com/). I called Southside on 7/27/16 and was told by the director that they had a vacant spot. My husband went to register him the next day and he told the director that our son was unvaccinated and that we had an exemption. She said that she did not accept unvaccinated children because it was too risky to expose children and pregnant mothers to unvaccinated children. I contacted the Department of Education, and was told by the person I spoke with that she had never heard of anyone being excluded from daycare because of an unvaccinated status. She recommended that I inform the daycare operator that allowing exemptions is in line with the daycare standards. I then called the center director and told her that we had religious and philosophical exemptions to vaccines and that she was in violation of the Louisiana State Law. She told me that I would never be able to enforce a vaccine exemption and our son would not be able to attend her center.

I contacted a lawyer regarding our situation (Kelley Dick, Jr., an Associate at Taylor Porter). He advised me that our only legal course of action was to file a temporary restraining order against the daycare for them to desist in barring us. Ideally, we would be able to obtain a legal injunction that would require the center to admit our child. **He was advised by his firm that we would need a \$20,000 retainer for him to take our case.** All of this would be required so that our son could attend a daycare that did not want him.

Hello Ms. Friedland,

I apologize for my delayed response, I was sick much of last week. I have connected with our Legal team and discussed your concerns.

LDE's Office of General Counsel interprets the provision in Section 1101, Subsection E, in BESE Bulletin 741 (Nonpublic) as an acknowledgment that private schools are permitted to grant admission to any student who is not vaccinated if the student or the student's parent or guardian presents a written statement from a doctor stating a medical reason why the student should not be vaccinated or a written dissent from the student or parent. However, it does not interpret that provision to mean that private schools are required to grant admission to such a student if the private school has a policy that requires all students to be vaccinated as a prerequisite to admission.

Let me know how else we can be of assistance and I hope this helps.







In the 2019-2020 Parent/Student Handbook, the Immunization Policy states:

Immunization Requirements

Students must provide a current immunization record signed by a physician in order to enter Pre-Kindergarten through 8th grade and be immunized according to state regulations (unless a booster cannot be administered because of the student's age). Additionally, students at least 11 years old must provide evidence of current immunizations against Meningococcal disease (Meningitis) and any other age-appropriate vaccine.

A student never previously immunized for MMR must receive two doses of the vaccine at least one month apart. This will satisfy the school entrance requirements for MMR immunizations. Many doctors will issue the State of Louisiana Universal Certificate of Immunization; others will issue a list of dates immunizations were received. Both are acceptable.

In the rare situation that a student's health would be in jeopardy due to receiving immunizations, the school requires a letter from the student's doctor and a notarized waiver. Parents must ask the principal for the school waiver form.





Dear Parents or Guardian:

According to Louisiana law <u>any student that is 11 years old and entering</u> <u>sixth grade</u> or any student that is <u>eleven years of age and in another grade</u> must show proof of immunization against Meningococcal Meningitis (MCV4) and any booster doses recommended by the Office of Public Health. Immunizations now required are listed below, in addition to the immunizations your child should have received before entering school.

- 1- Tdap-Booster
- 1- Meningitis Vaccine
- 1- Varicella- Booster

*The Varicella vaccine is waived if the student has had a history of chickenpox disease. The parent is responsible for reporting the case of chickenpox to the school nurse and the history must be documented on the immunization record.

Students that are 10 years of age and are entering sixth grade do not need to schedule an appointment to have the vaccinations completed until they turn 11.

Please be aware- your child will <u>NOT</u> be allowed to attend school if you fail to comply with obtaining the above immunizations. You should contact your local physician to schedule an appointment as soon as possible.

Updated immunization records will be due the first day of school.



Pre-Kindergarten / Daycare / HeadStart:

Beginning school year 2009-2010, two (2) doses of Varicella vaccine will be required in Louisiana schools for entry into Pre-K, Kindergarten, Daycare, and HeadStart programs for children aged 4 years and older. If a second dose of Varicella vaccine has been received at least 30 days after the first dose, no additional doses are required. This is in addition to the regular age appropriate vaccines required depending on the child's age. Prior to entry, these students must have documented proof of immunizations for: two (2) doses of Measles-Mumps-Rubella vaccine; three (3) doses of Hepatitis B vaccine; and booster doses of DTaP and Polio vaccines administered on or after their 4th birthday and prior to school entry.

All children aged less than 4 years of age enrolled in Pre-K, Daycare, HeadStart, etc should be vaccinated against and must show proof of immunizations for: Diphtheria Tetanus Acellular Pertussis vaccine (DTaP); Inactivated Poliovirus vaccine (IPV); Haemophilus Influenza Type B vaccine (Hib); Hepatitis B vaccine (HBV); Rotavirus vaccine (RV); Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV – for children less than 24 months of age) If a child is less than 24 months of age and has received 4 doses of PCV-7 he/she is to get a single dose of PCV-13 for Daycare and Head Start; and one (1) dose of Varicella vaccine. If the child is not complete or up-to-date for age, he/she must present a record indicating that the child is in progress of receiving vaccines, and follow-up must be provided for compliance with the above requirements.
